We Require...



If you have any of the COVID-19 symptoms while in school you **MUST** tell a member of staff. Your parents will be contacted and you will be asked to self-isolate as a family and get a test before returning to school.



You must sanitise your hands on entry to every classroom and at the start of the day when you enter the first building you walk into.



On days where you have PE in the timetable, come dressed for PE because changing rooms cannot be used. On wet days, bring your normal uniform with you, just in case you need to change.



Maintain social distancing from staff and students by making sure you use the correct playground space and toilets for your year group at break and lunch. Please use the external waiting areas for specific classrooms.



Follow the one way systems whenever you move about the site. This helps minimise congestion in key areas.



If you need to cough or sneeze, use the tissues and bins with lids available in every classroom and make sure you sanitise or wash your hands afterwards.



You should not arrive at school before 8:30am. This will help avoid congestion before the school gates open.



Check that you can access Edulink as well as Microsoft Teams. This will be important if we have to send a class or year group home and need to use remote learning.



In areas where you may not be able to maintain your distance from other students outside of your year group, we would encourage you to consider wearing a face covering.



You must remember all of your equipment for lessons and lunch card if using the canteen every day. Students should not share equipment and parents are not able to drop equipment off as they may have done previously.



Every student will have a different home context and think about COVID differently. We must respect one another's space, being considerate of others' views.
